



BSB51307 – Diploma of Occupational Health and Safety COURSE OUTLINE

Who is this program for?

The Diploma of Occupational Health and Safety is designed to give participants the underpinning knowledge of the role of an Occupational Health and Safety specialist.

Duration

The duration of the course is 12 months when completed as a traineeship, but in some circumstances, can be completed in less time.

Prerequisites

How is the Course delivered?

The course can be customised to suit your learning needs. It is run through a combination of facilitated training and on the job training with competency based written and group work assessment. There are also opportunities to arrange verbal assessment where literacy barriers are an issue.

Packaging Rules

A total of 8 units of competency must be completed.

Qualification

At the completion of all 8 units of competency, participants are awarded with the qualification, Diploma of Occupational Health and Safety, BSB51307. In the event that not all units are completed, statements of attainment are awarded for the units in which the participant has been found competent.

Enrolment Fee

Units of Competency

CODE	UNIT NAME	PURPOSE OF COMPETENCY
BSBOHS501B	Participate in the Coordination and Maintenance of a Systematic Approach to Managing OHS	This unit describes the systems and procedures that need to put in place to identify and manage the Occupational Health and safety risks in the workplace. This includes, systems for reporting and rectifying risks in order to create a safe environment for all workers.
BSBOHS502B	Participate in the Management of the OHS information and Data Systems	This unit describes the process of adequately documenting and reporting OHS related issues to stakeholders in order to manage a safe working environment.
BSBOHS503B	Assist in the Design and Development of OHS Participative Arrangements	This unit describes the participative arrangements, and roles required to be played by all employees and stakeholders in order to maintain OHS.
BSBOHS504B	Apply Principles of OHS Risk Management	This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to contribute to the management of Occupational Health and Safety risks in the workplace.
BSBOHS505C	Manage Hazards in the Work Environment	This unit covers the identification of hazards and the procedures required to manage their risk.
BSBOHS507B	Facilitate the Application of Principles of Occupational Health to Control OHS Risk	This unit provides a basis for managers to identify the impacts of agents in the workplace on the physical and psychological health of workers. It covers the facilitation of principles of OHS in order to manage that risk.
BSBOHS506B	Monitor and Facilitate the Management of Hazards Associated with plant	This unit describes the management of risks specific to Plants. This includes, but is not limited to : machinery, electrical equipment, pressure vessels and the plants ability to affect public safety.
BSBOHS508B	Participate in the investigation of incidents	This unit provides the skills required to investigate and deal with Occupational Health and Safety risks and incidents which have, or could potentially, cause an injury or damage. This includes writing reports and putting procedures in place.
